Allergen Labelling requirements

Food Standards Australia New Zealand (FSANZ) sets standards for labelling of products containing food allergens, gluten and sulphites.

Any product containing allergens specified in the Standard must be either:

- declared on a **label on packaged food**, or
- **declared on, or in connection with, the display of food** that is not required to be labelled, or
- **declared to the customer** at the time of purchase if they ask.



Allergen Labelling requirements

- Cereals containing gluten – wheat, rye, barley, oats and spelt
- Crustacea
- Egg
- Fish
- Milk
- Peanuts
- Soybeans
- Sesame seeds
- Tree Nuts
- Added Sulphites (10mg/kg or more)
- Lupin

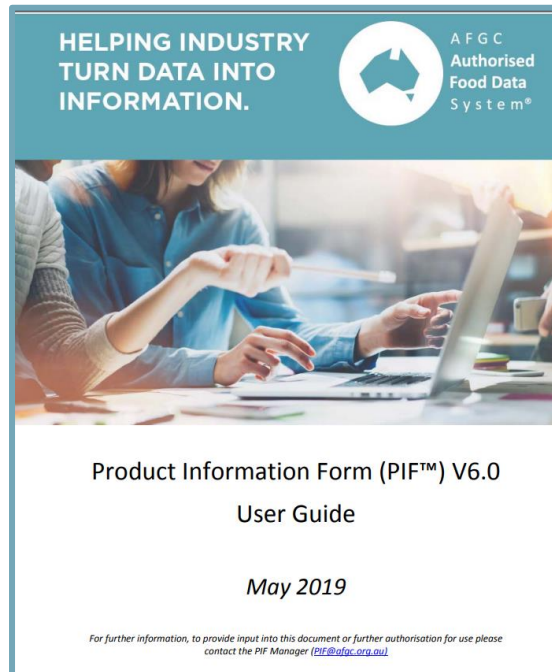
